



METHODOLOGY


The following survey was conducted by OnMessage in AZ, NC, & PA. Live telephone interviews were conducted on January 16-18, 2024.

This survey consists of 900 likely voters (300 in each state) and was stratified to reflect historical turnout. The margin of error for this survey is +/- 3.3%.

As you may know, there is currently a case before the Supreme Court regarding the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) removing safety standards that it once deemed necessary for the use of two abortion drugs. Specifically, the removal of these safety standards means that doctors are no longer required to provide ongoing, in-person care to women and girls using these drugs.

Do you support or oppose the FDA's decision to remove its safety standards?

FDA REMOVING SAFETY STANDARDS



If you knew the following were true, would it make you more likely or less likely to support the FDA reinstating its original safety standards for the use of abortion drugs?

According to the FDA, 1 in 25 women end up in the ER after taking these drugs, which is why a doctor's ongoing care was originally an FDA requirement.



The FDA originally required a follow-up doctor visit because side effects like life-threatening infections and severe bleeding can only be diagnosed with an in-person visit.



The FDA originally required an in-person doctor visit to check for ectopic pregnancies because taking abortion drugs with an ectopic pregnancy is extremely dangerous.
