

The CompassCare Case

Case Name: CompassCare v. Hochul

Case Status: Oral argument to be held at the 2nd Circuit Court of Appeals on Dec. 14, 2023.

Significance: Whether the government can force a pro-life organization to employ someone who undermines their mission.



Background: The State of New York enacted S-660, a law requiring religious organizations and groups to employ individuals who violate the mission of the organization. This includes religious pro-life groups and health care providers, such as pro-life pregnancy centers associated with CompassCare Pregnancy Services and the National Institute of Family and Life Advocates (NIFLA). It also includes churches like First Bible Baptist Church, who firmly believe that human life is sacred and worthy of protection from the moment of conception. Pregnancy centers like CompassCare serve women by providing all the facts a woman needs to truly make a fully informed decision, including facts about a baby's development, a woman's options during pregnancy, and the consequences of exercising those various options. The government should protect freedom, not take it away, and that's why Alliance Defending Freedom filed suit on behalf of CompassCare, NIFLA, and First Bible Baptist Church.
